**ORGANIZERS TO FORMALLY ANNOUNCE JUDGE PETER McBRIEN RECALL CAMPAIGN ON SOUTH STEPS OF CALIFORNIA STATE CAPITOL WEDNESDAY, APRIL 16, 2008 AT 12:30pm PST**

SACRAMENTO, CA. -- A rapidly growing group of outraged citizens, many of whom have been subjected to injustices inside Judge Peter McBrien's courtroom, said enough! It's time to draw a line in the sand. Angry, fearless, dedicated, organized, tested, well funded, ready to lead and armed with a recall petition that has been recently approved by Sacramento officials, the Recall McBrien Committee announced today that they have taken the next big step forward and will formally hold a press conference on the **south steps of the California State Capitol Wednesday, April 16, 2008 beginning at 12:30pm PST**. David Palmer, nationally known "judicial watchdawg", will moderate.

"Judge McBrien's conduct evidenced disregard of the principles of personal and official conduct embodied in the California Code of Judicial Ethics," declares Sacramento resident Donald Tenn. "I have never seen a more corrupt judiciary as I have seen at the William Ridgeway Family Relations Courthouse."

McBrien has presided as a family court judge for more than a decade, where he has heard more than 45,000 cases, the court said in a statement.

Judge McBrien is a disgrace to the American judiciary system and an extreme danger to children, petitioners and respondents. McBrien destroyed a young boy by awarding the father custody after multiple investigations substantiated he had sexually abused the boy. McBrien awarded custody to an abusive mother ignoring medical evidence and graphic pictures showing serious physical abuse to her young daughter.

The current recall drive is not the first time Judge McBrien has faced scrutiny. In April 2002, the Commission on Judicial Performance publicly admonished McBrien after he was charged with a felony and pled to a misdemeanor for destroying oak trees on public land because they obscured the view of the American River from his home. He and a cohort were fined a mere \$500 for this most egregious crime against nature and paid a sum of \$20,000 in restitution for the nature center.

"We want to send a message to McBrien and all judges that they will be held accountable," proclaims Ulf Carlsson. "I, like so many before me, had come to this country to pursue the American Dream. With an unconscionable stroke of a pen, Judge Peter J. McBrien took it all away."

In what will become a powerful Earth Day tie-in complete with a giant chainsaw prop representing Peter "Chainsaw" McBrien, a follow-up petition drive and family law court reform rally will take place at the William Ridgeway Family Relations Courthouse on EARTH DAY, Tuesday, April 22, 2008 from 8:00am to 10:00am. The courthouse is located at 3341 Power Inn Road, Sacramento, CA.
